

TOWN OF STONY PLAIN MOURNS THE PASSING OF HOCKEY LEGEND GLENN HALL

The Town of Stony Plain is mourning the passing of Glenn Henry Hall, a legendary National Hockey League goaltender and longtime Stony Plain resident, who passed away on January 7, 2026, at the age of 94.

Born on October 3, 1931, in Humboldt, Saskatchewan, Hall became one of the most

accomplished and respected goaltenders in professional hockey history. Known throughout the sport as Mr. Goalie, he played 18 seasons in the NHL with the Detroit Red Wings, Chicago Black Hawks, and St. Louis Blues. Hall was a pioneer of the butterfly style of goaltending and set an enduring NHL record by starting 502 consecutive games, making him one of the most notable NHL play-

ers in history.

His career achievements include winning the Stanley Cup, earning the Calder Memorial Trophy, three Vezina Trophies, and the Conn Smythe Trophy, and being inducted into the Hockey Hall of Fame in 1975.

After retiring from professional hockey, Hall made Stony Plain his home and became a valued and respected member of the communi-

ty, known for his generosity and mentorship. His legacy is permanently reflected in the town through the Glenn Hall Centennial Arena, a key community recreation facility located at 5300-52 Street, which proudly bears his name.

Mayor William Choy shares his condolences on behalf of Council, "Glenn Hall was more than a hockey icon; he was a proud member of our community. Having our arena named in his honour and a mural telling his story reflects the deep respect Stony Plain holds for him. His legacy will continue to inspire athletes and residents for generations."

Town Manager Tom Goulden says, "Glenn Hall's achievements on the ice were extraordinary, but in Stony Plain he was valued most for the way he lived his life off the ice. He was a long-time resident who cared deeply about this community, supported local hockey, and took the time to connect with people in a genuine and meaningful way."

Outside the arena, a 30-foot mural celebrates Hall's remarkable career and his connection to Stony Plain, serving as a lasting visual tribute to his impact on both the sport of hockey and the local community.

"Mr. Goalie by artist Tag Kim captures Glenn Hall's remarkable career while also recognizing the deep connection he and his family had to Stony Plain," says Culture and Tourism Officer Chantelle Laberge. "The mural reflects not only his accomplishments in professional hockey, but also the enduring impact he had on this community and the contributions he made beyond the rink."

The Town of Stony Plain extends its sincere condolences to Glenn Hall's family, friends, and the many people whose lives he touched.

ALBERTA UPDATES WILD BOAR MANAGEMENT PROGRAM

The Government of Alberta has updated its Wild Boar Control Program, introducing regulatory changes that affect wild boar ownership, containment standards, and overall management. These updates are particularly relevant for County landowners and agricultural producers, and have already generated early questions and informal feedback within the community.

Key points residents should know:

- Wild boar are classified as an agricultural pest in Alberta and pose significant risks to agriculture, livestock, and natural areas.
- The Province has strengthened its approach to controlling and eliminating wild boar, including changes that impact existing operations.
- New requirements have been introduced regarding reporting, containment, and regulatory compliance.
- The overall goal is to prevent the spread of wild boar and reduce long-term impacts on farmland and environment.

Wild boar are already prohibited under the County's Prohibited Animals Bylaw # 10-2019, and the Province's updated program aligns with the County's long-standing approach to preventing the keeping or introduction of prohibited species in the community.

The role of Agriculture Services is to help make residents aware of these provincial changes and direct them to the Province's official information, rather than interpret or enforce the regulations locally. THE COUNTY'S WINTER ROAD MAINTENANCE PROGRAM – IN A NUTSHELL

The County maintains range roads, township roads and subdivision roads. After a snowfall event, our Public Works crews begin to clear these corridors quickly, safely, and in accordance with standard County procedures.

With the goal to clear the County's road network as efficiently as possible after a snowfall event ends — our snow-clearing priorities are as follows:

Priority 1: Fire stations and main roadways – these routes carry the highest traffic volume, including collector roads

Priority 2: Local roadways – the feeder roads with lower traffic volumes

Priority 3: Subdivisions and hamlets

Priority 4: Snowplow flags, parking lots, and back alleys

Please keep in mind that the Province of Alberta is responsible for all maintenance including snow clearing on highways throughout the County. This includes highways 18, 22, 33, 37, 43, 633, 642, 647, 654, 757, 764, 765 & 777. The County has no jurisdiction over these highways.

ALBERTA RCMP WARN OF SPIKE IN FATAL COLLISIONS AMID WINTER CONDITIONS

Parkland RCMP are urging drivers to use extra caution on Alberta roads after a sharp increase in fatal collisions during December and early January. Preliminary

data shows 20 fatal collisions occurred across K Division in December; above the 10-year average of 16.7.

Winter weather and the recent snowfalls may have contributed to a significant portion of these crashes. Injury collisions also ap-

pear to be up. This trend has continued into the new year. Four fatal collisions in Alberta, resulting in four deaths, were reported in the first four days of January. Weather is believed to be a factor in three of those incidents, though investiga-

tions remain ongoing.

Police are reminding motorists to slow down, allow extra time for travel, and adjust driving habits to winter conditions. Waiting for better road conditions is always an option as well.

ROCK SOLID REFORMS FOR SAND AND GRAVEL

Submitted by Government of Alberta

Alberta's government is acting fast on 15 recommendations delivered by the Sand and Gravel Task Force report to modernize private land sand and gravel pit regulation.

Sand and gravel operations supply the materials that build Alberta's homes, roads and infrastructure. Modernizing Alberta's approach will help create jobs, protect the environment and support a fast-growing economy.

"Sand and gravel help build the roads we drive on, the homes we live in and the infrastructure that supports our province. It also helps create jobs and grow our economy. These recommendations will help get rid of unnecessary government bureaucracy, create more opportunities in the sand and gravel sector and protect our strong environmental safeguards."

Currently, there are more than 1,000 active sand and gravel pit registrations on private land across the province. For years, landowners and companies have complained about slow regulatory processes, confusing approval

conditions and inconsistent timelines.

Launched in May 2025, the Sand and Gravel Task Force reviewed Alberta's current policies and processes to find ways to shorten application timelines and reduce regulatory barriers, while maintaining environmental standards. The final report identifies 15 recommendations to reduce delays, better support landowners and strengthen Alberta's aggregate supply chain. These include improving policies, streamlining processes, helping industry navigate regulatory processes and balancing economic development and environmental assurance.

"The sand and gravel sector creates important jobs and revenue for many rural communities and landowners. I'm proud of the collaborative work that went into this report and look forward to seeing these recommendations put into action."

Three recommendations have already been implemented. Alberta has set formal service standards for application review timelines under both the Water Act and Environmental Protection and Enhancement Act. Applications are now processed concurrently across regulators. Alberta Environment and Protected Areas staff are working closely with operators and industry to share information on best practices and requirements.

Seven recommendations will be completed within the next six months. The recommendations include clarifying the roles and responsibilities of regulatory partners, improving communication with operators and introducing designated liaisons to support applicants throughout the process.

The remaining five recommendations will be completed within the next year. Alberta will expand automation and digitizing of the application process, allowing real-time application tracking, creating a one-stop shop for resources and tools to help industry, and developing templates that provide examples of high-quality applications to save operators time and further reduce re-

view timelines.

"The efforts and recommendations put forward by the task force and corresponding implementation by the Alberta government will provide the support and certainty the industry needs to continue to invest, create jobs and ensure an adequate supply of sand and gravel for our province. Our organization has already experienced some of these efficiencies, which has allowed us to expand our operations and hire more people in the communities in which we operate."


