The Town of Stony Plain is mourning the passing of Glenn Henry Hall, a leg-

endary National Hockey League goaltender and longtime Stony Plain resident, who passed away on January 7, 2026, at the age of 94.

Born on October 3, 1931, in Humboldt, Saskatchewan, Hall became one of the most accomplished and respected

goaltenders in professional hockey history. Known throughout the sport as Mr. Goalie, he played 18 seasons in the NHL with the Detroit Red Wings, Chicago Black Hawks, and St. Louis Blues. Hall was a pioneer of the butterfly style of goal-tending and set an enduring NHL record by starting 502 consecutive games, making

him one of the most notable NHL players in history.

His career achievements include winning the Stanley Cup, earning the Calder Memorial Trophy, three Vezina Trophies, and the Conn Smythe Trophy, and being inducted into the Hockey Hall of Fame in 1975.

After retiring from professional hockey, Hall made Stony Plain his home and became a valued and re-

spected member of the community, known for his generosity and mentorship. His legacy is permanently reflected in the town through the Glenn Hall Centennial Arena, a key community recreation facility located at 5300-52 Street, which proudly bears his name.

Social housing

This subsidized housing option is for families and individuals facing financial hardship. We understand the immense value that a secure and affordable home can provide in times of financial strain. This program is designed to ensure

that families and individuals spend no more than 30% of their total household income on housing, including rent, heat, water and sewer services. We have a limited number of available rental units in each community, so it is important to get on our waitlist. Housing units are rented based on the greatest need rather than on a first come first serve basis.

Rental Assistance Benefit Program

The Evergreens Foundation is proud to offer and facilitate the Rental Assistance Benefit Program on behalf of the Provincial Government, which helps make housing more affordable for individuals and families in our communities. Support is available for those whose household earnings fall below the income threshold for their community. This initiative is part of the National Housing Strategy.

Senior Lodging

Our lodge program provides housing for Alberta Seniors no longer wishing to or unable to maintain a full household on their own. Our lodges are available for affordable monthly rents and are situated in the heart of rural communities so you can remain in the communities you love. URBAN AGRICULTURE IS GROWING: BEEKEEPING AND HEN KEEPING TAKE FLIGHT IN STONY PLAIN

The Town of Stony Plain is excited to announce residents can now apply for urban beekeeping and hen keeping licences, bringing a little more buzz and cluck to the community.

Urban beekeeping and hen keeping are permitted under the Non-Domestic Animal Bylaw approved by Council on June 23, 2025, following community interest and a review of best practices from other municipalities. The bylaw establishes clear standards for training, mentorship, animal care, and community impact to support responsible small-scale urban agriculture.

Expanding urban agriculture reflects the Town's commitment to

environmental responsibility, a key pillar of the 2025-2028 Strategic Plan. Beekeeping and hen keeping are also key actions from the Environmental Stewardship Strategy, which guides initiatives to protect local ecosystems and advance long-term sustainability goals.

"We've heard from residents who are eager to start beekeeping and hen keeping, and I'm excited to see their success," says Mayor William Choy. "Urban agriculture isn't just about food; it's about growing community. Keeping bees and hens helps create a healthier, more connected community by sharing knowledge, and supporting each other through sustainable practices."

Prospective keepers must complete relevant

training and find an experienced mentor for at least their first year. Education and mentorship ensure new keepers are set up for success while safeguarding community interests and animal welfare. Applicants are also required to notify their neighbours before setting up their hives or coops.

Highlights

Beekeeping

- Maximum two hives per property
- Hives must meet location and care standards
- Keepers must follow best practices to support colony health and minimize impacts on neighbours

Hen keeping

- Minimum of two hens and a maximum of six
- Coops must meet size, locations, cleanliness, and care standards

No roosters

"By setting clear standards, the Town is empowering residents to act responsibly, respect their neighbours, promote animal welfare, and strengthen community well-being," says Mayor Choy.

"Urban agriculture opportunities like this spark curiosity and inspire life-long learning," says Evan Joyes, Sustainability Planner. "Whether you're tending hens or managing hives, these activities help people learn about pollinators, sustainability, food production, and local food systems. It's a rewarding hobby that benefits the whole community."

Alberta Community Response Team became aware of a stolen Chevrolet truck being followed by a civilian in the area of Parkland County. Police located the stolen Chevrolet truck and successfully deployed a Tire Deflation Device. The Chevrolet truck came to a stop on a rural property in the area of Alberta Beach. The accused was

quickly taken into custody before further offences could be committed on the civilian property. Police arrested Jasen Pappin, a 47-year-old male resident of Parkland County.

Jasen Pappin is charged with:

- Possession of Property Obtained by Crime over \$5000;
- Operate a Motor

Vehicle while Unauthorized;

- Failure to comply with a Release Order (x4);
- Resist Arrest.

Jasen Pappin was held for a bail hearing and was remanded into custody. He is to appear in the Alberta Court of Justice in St Albert on Jan. 28, 2026 at 9:30 AM.

ALBERTA RCMP WARN OF SPIKE IN FATAL COLLISIONS AMID WINTER CONDITIONS

Parkland RCMP are urging drivers to use extra caution on Alberta roads after a sharp increase in fatal collisions during December and early January. Preliminary

data shows 20 fatal collisions occurred across K Division in December; above the 10-year average of 16.7.

Winter weather and the recent snowfalls may have contributed to a significant portion of these crashes. Injury collisions also ap-

pear to be up. This trend has continued into the new year. Four fatal collisions in Alberta, resulting in four deaths, were reported in the first four days of January. Weather is believed to be a factor in three of those incidents, though investiga-

tions remain ongoing.

Police are reminding motorists to slow down, allow extra time for travel, and adjust driving habits to winter conditions. Waiting for better road conditions is always an option as well.

ALBERTA RCMP ISSUES 998 TICKETS OVER THE HOLIDAYS

From Dec. 24-31, 2025, the Alberta RCMP was busy conducting enhanced traffic safety enforcement throughout the province, resulting in 998 tickets being issued.

Of the 998 tickets issued, 242 were for speeding, 31 for distracted driving and 21 for seatbelt infractions.

As well, 121 drivers were removed from the roads for being impaired due to drugs and/or alcohol, including 80 Immediate Roadside Sanction (IRS) FAILs and 23

IRS WARNS.

Unfortunately, due to road-related incidents, there were 99 non-fatal injury collisions and six fatal collisions, resulting in seven fatalities.

"We are never happy to report fatal motor vehicle collisions," says Sgt. Dar-

rin Turnbull, Alberta RCMP Traffic. "Everyone should have been able to make it home safely for the holidays. I encourage everyone to look out for each other on the roads. If you suspect an impaired driver, call 911 immediately."






