HAVE A SAY ON ALBERTA'S PRIVATE-SECTOR PRIVACY LAW

Submitted by Government of Alberta

Albertans and private-sector organizations are invited to share their views through a public survey to help modernize the Personal Information Protection Act.

The Personal Information Protection Act sets the rules for how private organizations collect, use, disclose and protect personal information. The act came into force in 2004 and has not been substantially updated since 2010, despite significant changes in technology,

data use and public expectations around privacy.

Modernizing the act is an important step in ensuring Albertans have the strongest privacy protections in today's digital world. Updates will explore ways to strengthen privacy

LEDUC RCMP LAY CHARGES IN NISKU BREAK AND ENTER

rights, align with global standards and support innovation, while ensuring personal information is respected and protected.

"Albertans expect the strongest privacy protections in the country, and we want to hear directly from

them to help shape the updated Protection of Privacy Act. This engagement process is extremely important to help shape modern, effective privacy laws that protect personal information while supporting innovation and business within our province."

As part of this modernization process, Alberta's government will be conducting a public consultation process from Feb. 2 to May 1. This includes an online survey that will run Feb. 2 to Feb. 16. Input from Albertans, subject-matter experts, private organizations and the information and privacy commissioner will be carefully considered to help inform potential updates to the act and its regulation.

Alberta's government has been engaging with stakeholders on privacy legislation since 2021. This renewed engagement will help confirm priorities, assess impacts on organizations and ensure future changes reflect Albertans' expectations and today's digital realities.

•Dangerous operation of motor vehicle

•Mischief under \$5000

Houle has additionally been charged with:

- Fail to comply with release order condition
 - Numerous infractions under the Traffic Safety Act
- Following a Judicial Interim Release hearing, Powder

was released on a release order . Powder's next appearance is Feb.5 2026 at the Alberta Court of Justice in Leduc.

A Judicial Interim Release hearing was also held for Houle. Houle was remanded into custody and his next appearance is Feb.19, 2026 at the Alberta Court of Jus-

tice in Leduc.

MASKWACIS RCMP ISSUED A SHELTER IN PLACE FOR LOUIS BULL FIRST NATION CONCLUSION

On Feb. 4, 2026, at 12:09 a.m., Maskwacis RCMP responded to a report of a shooting at a residence on Louise Bull First Nation. Upon arrival, police located two victims. One

of the victims, 23 year-old Zyon Littlepoplar, was deceased. The second victim, a 54-year-old male, was taken to hospital where he remains in critical but stable condition.

RCMP began deploying a great deal of resources to the community to both

investigate the occurrence and locate the suspect. Responding officers quickly located an abandoned vehicle nearby believed to be associated to the suspects. RCMP Air Services, a Police Dog, and the Emergency Response Team were deployed to assist. RCMP issued a shelter in place for Louis Bull First Nation to protect the public while police tracked these purported dangerous armed suspects.

Officers were successful in locating and arresting three suspects.

The Alberta RCMP Major Crimes Unit was deployed and took carriage of the investigation. Investigation was able to identify one of the suspects as

committing the shooting. The other two arrested suspects were confirmed as not being involved and were released without charges.

As a result, RCMP have charged Edmonton resident 27-year-old ,Dallas Daniel Lee, with:

- Second-Degree-Murder;
- Attempted Murder.

Lee was taken before a Justice of the Peace and remanded into custody with his next court date set for Feb. 5, 2026, at the Alberta Court of Justice in Wetaskiwin.

IF MY CHILD IS WITNESSING BULLYING:

- Explore the different options for your child to stand up against bullying

HOT STREAK: ALBERTA SETS ALL-TIME HOUSING RECORD

Alberta is building homes faster than ever, shattering housing construction records for the second year in a row and driving down rents.

Alberta is getting shovels in the ground and roofs over Albertans' heads at record pace. In 2025, the province delivered a second record year for housing starts, breaking several all-time records along the way. For the first time in Alberta's history, more than 50,000 housing starts were reached in a single year, with more than 53,000 homes breaking ground in the past 12 months – 14 per cent higher than the previous record set in 2024.

Q2 2025 marked the strongest quarter for housing construction in provincial history, with more than 17,000 housing starts, eclipsing a record set almost 10 years ago.

“Once again, Alberta is punching above our weight. Our province is shattering housing records and building at unprecedented rates, keeping pace as more people than

ever before call our great province home.”

Alberta is setting the pace for housing construction in Canada. For the second year in a row, the province led the country in housing starts per capita. Despite making up less than 12 per cent of Canada's population, Alberta built almost a quarter of housing starts across the country in 2025, and more than 80 per cent of all starts across the prairies.

These results show the province's plan is working. Alberta is slashing red tape through initiatives like the Stop Housing Delays portal, supporting innovative housing strategies and fostering an investment-friendly, low-tax environment that has incentivized housing construction provincewide as more people than ever before choose to call Alberta home. By removing barriers and enabling builders, Alberta has cemented its place as a heavyweight in the housing world.

riers are reduced and regulatory systems evolve to support growth. These conditions have especially helped unlock record rental construction, easing pressure on renters and strengthening long-term affordability.”

Increase in rental builds leads to rental asking prices going down

This year also brought good news for renters, with rents in Alberta decreasing almost double the national average. As we enter 2025, Alberta's average asking rent is about \$400 per month below the national average, and outside of the larger cities, Alberta communities made up six out of the top 10 most affordable small- and mid-size rental markets in Canada, including taking all four of the top spots. Notably, the number of purpose-built rentals being developed in the province soared in 2025 to nearly 20,000 starts – almost triple the levels seen a decade ago.

Building affordable housing for low-income Albertans

Alberta's government is committed to ensuring Albertans with low incomes have access to safe, stable and affordable housing. Alberta's government is currently providing affordable housing to more than 60,000 households across the province, including rental assistance for more than 13,000 households. Since the launch of the Stronger Foundations 10-year affordable housing strategy in 2021, Alberta's government is almost halfway to achieving its goal of supporting an additional 25,000 affordable households by 2031.

ALBERTA LEADS CANADA IN RED TAPE REDUCTION

Alberta has once again earned top marks for cutting red tape, solidifying the province's position as the best place in Canada to live, work and do business.

The Canadian Federation of Independent Business (CFIB) has reaffirmed Alberta's position as the best place in Canada to live, work and do business, awarding the province top marks during Red Tape Reduction Week. Alberta's government has received the prestigious Golden Scissors Award, the highest national honour for eliminating red tape. For the fourth consecutive year, Alberta also received an A

grade for its ongoing commitment to cutting unnecessary regulations.

Since 2019, Alberta's government has eliminated nearly 220,000 unnecessary regulatory requirements, saving Albertans and businesses more than \$3 billion. The results of the report card reflect the province's focus on making it easier to do business and invest across Alberta.

“We're proud of our record and we're always looking to make things better – and for good reason. Reducing red tape helps Alberta businesses, taxpayers and families save time and money to create jobs and grow their business.”

The CFIB awards also highlight Alberta's nation-leading red tape reduction initiative, the Automatic Yes Toolkit, which speeds up and simplifies permit approvals by replacing unnecessary permits with clear rules and firm timelines that hold government accountable. As part of ongoing work to cut red tape, ministries are required to offset any new regulations by cutting existing ones, keeping red tape in check and creating a competitive, business-friendly environment for entrepreneurs and industry.


