WETASKIWIN AND MASKWACIS RCMP TEAM UP TO ARREST REPEAT OFFENDER

On Feb. 27, 2026, at approximately 11:30 p.m., the Wetaskiwin Crime Reduction Unit was on proactive

patrol in south Wetaskiwin. Members observed a dark coloured sedan travelling East on 40 Avenue. The license plate attached to the sedan was obstructed by snow, making it illegible.

A traffic stop was attempted but the sedan engaged in a flight from police and failed to stop at a stop sign. A pursuit was not initiated. Neighbouring detachments

ALBERTA RCMP WARN THE PUBLIC OF SPRING SCAM SEASON

The Alberta RCMP is advising that with the change of season comes an increase in certain scams. RCMP are already responding to reports of paving and distraction/gold scams.

Paving scams are very common. Contractors claim to have leftover materials from previous jobs and offer to pave driveways and parking lots at reduced pricing. Companies may use business names that suggest they are affiliated with a government road

maintenance department and typically provide false addresses or contact information. After contractors collect payment and disappear from the area, customers discover the materials used are poor quality and the work is unprofessional.

were updated and provided a vehicle description. Maskwacis RCMP members advised that they located the sedan on Highway 611. Wetaskiwin Crime Reduction members arrived in the area and observed the sedan until it came to a stop. Crime Reduction members

engaged the sedan with a Tactical Vehicle Intervention Technique to prevent another flight & mitigate risk to the public.

As a result of this investigation, Bobby Larenze Bull (26) was identified as the driver and charged with the following:

- Flight From Peace Officer;

- Dangerous operation of motor vehicle;
- Offences under the Traffic Safety Act (x4).

Bull was taken before a Justice of the Peace and initially remanded however later released with his next court date set for March 17, 2026 at the Alberta Court of Justice in Wetaskiwin.

Alberta RCMP Warn The Public Of Spring Scam Season

Victims are sometimes left unable to contact the scammers and face expensive asphalt repairs or in other incidents, the contractors attempt to intimidate the customer into paying after the work is completed for poor product and services.

Keep the following tips in mind to avoid falling victim to a paving scam:

- Ask for names of previous customers and verify that they were satisfied with the work.
- Research the company through the Better Business Bureau in Alberta, the Consumer Investigations Unit, your local Rural Crime Watch, or on social media.
- Obtain a written quote that includes the full

business name, address, phone number, GST number, as well as provincial and municipal license numbers, if applicable.


- Quotes should specify the quantity and quality of materials being offered. Be skeptical if contractors decline to provide this information.
- Seek estimates from reputable companies to compare costs.
- Do not agree to a contract if you feel pressured or if the contractor refuses to take "no" for an answer.
- Be leery of unsolicited offers. If it sounds too good to be true, it probably is!
- Do not pay for services upfront, before the work is done.

Distraction/Gold scams mostly occur in retail parking lots. Victim is approached by a seemingly stranded motorist. Scammer claim they need money for food, gas, or airfare to get home, and offer fake gold or jewellery for exchange. The scammer often cites hardship, such as the recent death of a family member, or referencing sad-looking children in their vehicles in order to solicit a sympathetic response from victims. The scammers will sell what turns out to be fake jewelry or use distraction techniques to remove real jewellery from a victim.

Keep the following tips in mind to avoid falling victim to distraction/gold scams:

- Always remain vigilant

- Secure your valuables.
- Be cautious of strangers in your personal space or attempting to hug or touch you.
- Trust your instincts and don't be afraid to say no or yell for help if you feel uncomfortable.
- Walk away from any suspicious person or behaviour.

IS IT TIME FOR YOUR MAMMOGRAM?

Screen Test is coming to Stony Plain March 27 to 31, 2026 and Enoch Cree Nation April 1, 2026

Screen Test is a free service provided by Primary Care Alberta that offers screening mammograms. Our mobile screening units travel to 120 communities throughout Alberta to provide convenient access to breast cancer screening.

Having regular screening mammograms is the best way to find breast cancer early, before symptoms appear and when treatment may work better.

Who should have a screening mammogram?

If you're 45 to 74, you don't need a referral to have a mammogram. Make screening part of your regular health routine. Plan to have a mammogram every 2 years or as decided by you and your healthcare provider.

If you're 40 to 44 or over 75, discuss the risks and benefits of screening with your healthcare provider. You will need a referral if you're 40 to 44 and it's your first

mammogram, or if you're over 75.

Breast density scores are now included in your Screen Test result letter

Breast density is the amount of dense tissue compared to the amount of fat in a person's breasts. It can be harder to find cancer in dense breasts because this tissue appears white on a mammogram, the same colour as many kinds of breast cancer. It's common to have dense breast tissue.

Dense breasts are only one of many risk factors for breast cancer. Other factors, such as age and genetics, have a bigger impact on your overall risk. You can't tell how dense your breasts are by size, look or feel. The only way to find out is by having a mammogram.

Talk to your healthcare provider about your breast density score and your personal risk of breast cancer.



COUNCIL HIGHLIGHTS

Submitted by Yellowhead County

RCMP Annual Priorities Input Request

Representatives from the three RCMP detachments that service Yellowhead County (Edson, Hinton, and Evansburg) presented to Council and requested input for Policing priorities for the coming year. Priorities identified included crime reduction, traffic control, and community relations.

Road Planning Workshop
Council will be reviewing options pertaining to the development of a long-term road development for Yellowhead County. Items such as enhanced road standards, paving, new road builds, etc. will be considered in the long-term plan. A Road Planning Workshop is scheduled for the spring of 2026 for Council.

Alberta Rural Health Week Proclamation

Council proclaimed May 25-29, 2026 as Alberta Rural Health Week in Yellowhead County. The proclamation recognizes the dedication of rural healthcare professionals, volunteers, and community partners who support the health and well-being of rural residents.

Fulham School – Additional Letters Received

Additional letters were received from community members after the Fulham Community School presentation at the Governance and Priorities meeting on February 17. Council accepted the letters as information.

Fulham School Financial Support Request

Council postponed the discussion of the \$400,000 financial request over three years from the Fulham Community School Council un-

til Grand Yellowhead Public School Division makes a final determination regarding the school's future. The expected date for the school board's decision is April 15, 2026.

YCE Multiplex Tender: Mechanical Contract Conversion

As recommended by Clark Builders, Council directed Administration to convert the contract for the supply and installation of the mechanical scope of work for the YCE Multiplex to Goldbar Contractors Inc., in the amount of \$11,867,858 (inclusive of bonding; exclusive of GST).

Bylaw 01.26 Repeals Cougar Rock Area Structure Plan

Bylaw 8.01, the Cougar Rock ASP, was prepared exclusively for a development that is no longer in progress. At previous Council meetings, first reading was given to Bylaw 01.26 and a Public Hearing was held. Council for Yellowhead County gave second and third reading to Bylaw 01.26 to repeal Bylaw 8.01.

Tender: Evansburg-Wildwood Area Gravel Supply

Council awarded the Evansburg-Wildwood Area Gravel Supply Tender (2026-2029) to McLeod Valley Sand & Gravel in the amount of \$2,839,290.00.

Tender: West of Edson Area Gravel Supply

Council awarded the West of Edson Area Gravel Supply Tender (2026-2029) to Wapiti Gravel Suppliers, a Division of

Colas Western Canada Inc., in the amount of \$1,039,350.00.

Tender: Crack Sealing of Local Roads

Council awarded the Crack Sealing of Local Roads Tender (2026-2027) to Federal Sealing Services Ltd. in the amount of \$620,316.80.

Tender: Twp Rd 544 Reconstruction

Council awarded the Reconstruction of Township Road 544 Tender, from Range Road 165 to Range Road 162, to Barsi Enterprises Ltd. in the amount of \$2,366,651.00 plus GST.

Tender: Range Road 124 Reconstruction

Council awarded the Reconstruction of Range Road 124 Tender, north of Township Road 560 to Barsi Enterprises Ltd. in the amount of \$754,068.05 plus GST.

FRIAA FireSmart Program – Marlboro/Millers Lake Mitigation Strategy

Yellowhead County Protective Services provides wildfire prevention, FireSmart work, and education to residents. Several grants have been received towards this work, and recently the County was successful in obtaining a grant to develop a Mitigation Strategy for the area of Marlboro/Millers Lake. Council supported the project and added the FRIAA Grant to the 2026 Final Budget for approval.

ALBERTANS HELP SHAPE DISABILITY ASSISTANCE PROGRAM

Submitted by Government of Alberta

Alberta's government continues to make progress on the Alberta Disability Assistance Program, thoughtfully designing the program based on feedback from Albertans.

Albertans with disabilities and the organizations that support them have consistently called for social services that better reflect the diverse needs, abilities and goals of people living with disabilities. Many have also highlighted the importance of creating opportunities for individuals who are able to pursue employment while still receiving the supports they rely on.

In response, Alberta's government announced in February 2025 that it would develop the Alberta Disability Assistance Program (ADAP). Offered in addition to the Assured Income

for the Severely Handicapped (AISH) program, ADAP will empower Albertans with disabilities to pursue meaningful employment while continuing to receive the supports they need.

"I want to thank each Albertan who took the time to participate in the engagement and provide feedback on the new Alberta Disability Assistance Program – your feedback is directly helping to shape this program, and helping ensure we get this right for our friends and neighbours who will rely on it."

ADAP is being thoughtfully designed, based on the input of Albertans with disabilities. As the Ministry of Assisted Living and Social Services reviews the feedback provided by Albertans, some key decisions have been made, informed by the engagement:

1. Increasing the employment income exemption for single clients on ADAP to \$700 per month:

oThis means individuals on ADAP will be able to earn up to \$700 per month before it begins to affect financial benefits.

oAlbertans on ADAP will be able to earn more than \$45,000 in employment income while continuing to receive financial benefits. This will be the highest limit for employment income while receiving financial benefits of any comparable disability income assistance program in Canada.

oAlbertans on ADAP will continue to receive the health benefits they need, regardless of employment income.

oDetailed calculations for ADAP employment income exemptions will be set out in a ministerial order later this spring.

2. Current AISH clients who

meet one or more of the below criteria will automatically remain on AISH, unless they choose to transition to ADAP to benefit from ADAP's higher employment income exemptions:

oIndividuals with a severe and profound developmental disability, and/or who are deemed eligible for or are receiving Persons with Developmental Disabilities services

oIndividuals with palliative or terminal medical conditions

oIndividuals living in continuing care homes

oIndividuals 60 years of age or older

3. Alberta's government will cover the cost of one medical assessment for current AISH clients who transition to ADAP July 1, and later choose to be reassessed for AISH.

oThis support is not time-limited and will be available whenever clients choose to access it.



BUILDING HOMES FOR ALBERTA SENIORS

Alberta's government is committing more than \$200 million to build and upgrade seniors housing across the province.

As Alberta's seniors population grows at an unprecedented pace, Alberta's government is investing record amounts to support seniors and ensure the province's seniors housing stock grows along with it. Alberta's government created the Seniors Lodge Modernization Program and is committing hundreds of millions of dollars to build new seniors lodges and upgrade existing ones, ensuring Alberta seniors can age with dignity in the communities they've helped build.

"Seniors have made enormous contributions to the communities we live in today, and they deserve housing that reflects that. By investing more than \$200 million to modernize and expand seniors lodges, Alberta's government is helping ensure seniors can continue living in the communities they helped build, with the comfort, dignity

If passed, Budget 2026 would commit \$150 million over the next three years for the Seniors Lodge Modernization Program. The Seniors Lodge Program is unique to Alberta and is the province's oldest social housing program. There are currently about 11,000 seniors lodge

units across the province, which serve as important community hubs - especially in rural communities. The Seniors Lodge Modernization Program brings together partners from public and non-profit organizations to provide comfortable, supportive housing for seniors in the communities where it's most needed.

"Affordable housing for seniors is more important than ever. The Government of Alberta's continued support helps us provide more affordable options for residents and improve the quality of

life for seniors. This funding supports the development of a new 102-unit subsidized seniors supportive lodge in Spruce Grove, a first of its kind in the city."






