PARKLAND RCMP ARREST AND CHARGE SUSPECT IN ARMED ROBBERY INVESTIGATIONS

Submitted by Parkland RCMP

On Dec. 30, 2025, at approximately 8:30 p.m., Parkland RCMP responded to an armed robbery with a weapon at a local gas station. The masked suspect entered the store, deployed bear spray at the employee and demanded money. After receiving cash, the suspect bear sprayed the employee a second time and fled

on foot. The Parkland General Investigation Section (GIS) has been conducting an extensive investigation to identify those responsible.

On Apr. 8, 2026, at approximately 10:30 p.m., Parkland RCMP responded to an armed robbery with a weapon at the same gas station. The masked suspect entered the store and brandished a weapon, threatening to spray the employee,

and demanded money. After receiving cash, the suspect fled on foot. The Parkland GIS quickly linked the two occurrences by suspect and involved vehicle Investigation determined that in the second robbery, the suspect was dropped off and picked up by an accomplice.

On Apr. 10, 2026, Parkland GIS members arrested 2

suspects and executed a search warrant on a vehicle and residence in Spruce Grove.

Kevin Tremblay, (52), a resident of Spruce Grove, has been charged with the following:

- Robbery with a weapon x2,
- Assault with a weapon x2,
- Commit an indictable offence while masked x2,
- Possession of a weapon for a

dangerous purpose x2.

Kevin Tremblay has been remanded in custody with his next court appearance on Apr. 15, 2026, at the Alberta Court of Justice in St. Albert.

Carmen Hansen, (48), a resident of Spruce Grove, has been charged with robbery with a weapon. Hansen was taken before a Justice of the Peace and release from custody with conditions and her next court appearance on Apr. 29, 2026,

at the Alberta Court of Justice in St. Albert.

“These armed robberies were violent acts, resulting in weapons being used on employees of this business” states Sergeant Kuca, Commander of Parkland RCMP Plain Clothes Unit. “These investigations can be complex, and lengthy but I trust that identifying and charging these suspects helps to ensure public safety.”

SAFETY CODE PAYMENT UPDATE

LSAC.ca/planning

The County is updating its permit fee collection process. To improve efficiency, the administration and payment of Safety Code fees will now be managed by our accredited industry partner, Superior Safety Codes.

HOW PAYMENTS WORK NOW

When applying for a permit, your total costs may be split between two separate entities:

- **County Development Fees:** Upon submission, the Planning & Development team will notify you of any fees or levies owed directly to the County (e.g., Development Permit fees). These remain payable to the County office.
- **Safety Code Fees:** For Building, Private Sewage, Electrical, Plumbing, and Gas permits, the safety code fee portion is now handled exclusively by Superior Safety Codes. Once they receive your application, Superior will review it and contact you directly to collect payment.

SUBMISSION OPTIONS

You may still submit your completed application packages (including Safety Code forms) to the County Administration Office in person or via email to devassistant@LSAC.ca. We will continue to forward these to Superior on your behalf.

REDUCING TRUCKING BARRIERS

Alberta's government is leading the way in breaking down trucking barriers, making it faster and safer for truck drivers to move goods across Canada.

Alberta's government is launching the Canadian Trucking Regulations Hub, a made-in-Alberta digital tool that helps truck drivers navigate regulatory and op-

erational differences across provinces and territories.

"Alberta is proud to lead the development of this made-in-Alberta solution that supports truckers. By bringing key information together in one place, we are making it easier to navigate rules across jurisdictions, saving drivers time, and helping industry operate more effectively."

The Hub helps truck drivers plan their routes accurately so they can avoid low bridges and prevent costly infrastructure damage. It provides clear, accessible information which will help with links to permit information and safety code standards to navigate interprovincial trips. Instead of searching through multiple sources, the Hub brings everything together in one

place.

Alberta has worked closely with federal, provincial and territorial partners to develop and refine the tool, with all jurisdictions participating and contributing to data validation. Each province and territory will now be responsible for maintaining and validating its own data, ensuring information remains accurate and up to date. Responsibility for long-term management of the Hub is expected to transition to the Canadian Council of Motor Transport Administrators (CCMTA) in fall 2026.

"We welcome today's announcement and are pleased to work with the Alberta government to advance the implementation of the Canadian Trucking Hub, an important step toward improving the efficiency and safety of goods movement across the country."

Alberta's government is continuing to take action to strengthen the trucking industry by engaging with trucking companies and driving schools on issues facing the industry and how to address them. Measures include potential experience-based requirements for commercial drivers coming to Alberta, such as creating a two-year waiting period, as well as stronger penalties for damage to public infrastructure. This ongoing work reflects a continued focus on ensuring drivers are well-prepared, while protecting Alberta's transportation network and supporting safer roads.

3 POTENTIAL TROUBLE SIGNS FOR DRIVEWAYS

Though they are often easy to overlook, driveways are durable parts of a home that can greatly impact a home's curb appeal. Driveways endure quite a bit of wear and tear over their lifespans, and homeowners who have not given their driveways much thought may want to start looking for potential trouble signs that indicate a need for some driveway maintenance.

According to the on-

line home improvement resource HomeAdvisor.com, the average cost of a driveway installation in 2015 was just under \$3,700. Those costs are influenced by a host of factors, including the size of the driveway and the material its made of. Damaged driveways do not necessarily need to be replaced, as some may just need minor repairs. But homeowners who see any of the following trouble signs

in their driveways may want to consult a professional contractor to determine what their next steps should be.

1. Potholes

Potholes might be most often associated with heavily trafficked roadways, but even driveways are susceptible to potholes. As the ground beneath the driveway expands and contracts, the pavement above that ground weakens and becomes more susceptible

to damage. That damage may ultimately lead to large chunks of the driveway breaking down, creating holes as a result. Homeowners who live in areas that experience heavy snowfall may see their driveways develop potholes after they are shoveled or plowed. Potholes that are not fixed may damage vehicles that drive on the pavement, and potholes may even expand over time.

3 Potential Trouble Signs For Driveways

2. Accumulation of water

Puddles that form during a rainstorm may not be indicative of anything other than a rainy day. But water that pools or runs down the middle of the driveway may indicate drainage problems. Such problems may be the result of structural problems with the slope of the driveway, which can cause bigger issues down the road.

When water is not absorbed into the ground or directed away from your home, it can then flow into the house, potentially making your garage or home susceptible to water damage.

3. Cracks

Cracking is one of the more noticeable issues that can plague driveways. Many driveways experience cracking as materials inevitably succumb to the elements. Driveway cracks may

develop for various reasons, including poor initial installation. Tree roots that grow beneath the driveway surface may also contribute to cracking as the driveways ultimately succumb to the pressure created by the growing roots. Some cracks may prove less problematic than others, but homeowners should still speak with a contractor if they notice their driveway is starting to succumb to

cracks.

Driveways may not draw the attention of homeowners too often, but damaged driveways that go ignored may ultimately lead to very costly problems.

7 THINGS TO CONSIDER WHEN BUYING A SHED

Backyard sheds can be useful assets. Sheds can create storage space in the garage, basement or other areas of the house that have become gathering spots for gear typically used outdoors. Sheds are ideal for housing mowers, tools and even pool-care equipment. But they can be put to other uses as well, such as being key spots to engage in hobbies or even as a child's clubhouse.

Various factors should be considered before build-

ing or buying a shed. A storage shed can be a significant investment. Once placed, sheds may remain in their dedicated spots for years to come. That means careful thought should go into the planning process.

1. Check your local building codes first. Before you accumulate building materials or order a shed, be sure to know the ins and outs of shed codes. The codes may impact the shed's placement, construction, the materials used, size, and numerous

other factors. It's much easier to amend plans beforehand than to face the hassle and expense after learning you did things incorrectly.

2. Choose placement wisely. Spend several days assessing the yard and thinking about the uses for the shed. If you plan to store pool floats and chemicals inside of the shed, it should be located close enough to the pool to be convenient. Look at the lay of the land.

If there is a soggy patch of land that can turn swampy under the shed's foundation, that is a poor location choice. If you need access to electricity, placing it far away from the house could necessitate running expensive wiring.

3. Consider the design. Just because a shed is for storage doesn't mean aesthetics should be overlooked. Choose a shed style that complements your home. You may also

want to match certain architectural features, like arched doorways or dormers. Design also may relate to practicality. For instance, storing a riding mower inside may necessitate dual doors that open widely.

4. Invest in quality materials. Spending a little more and using quality materials can ensure it lasts long enough to be cost-effective. The right materials will be resistant to splitting, cracking, decay, and insect damage.

5. Prepare the site well. A proper foundation for the shed is almost as important as the shed itself. You cannot just drop the shed on the lawn and leave it, as the shed can sink or structural issues may arise if it is placed on a weak base.

6. Blend into the environment. Surround the shed with shrubs or plants so that it blends into the yard and complements the space.

7. Deck out the interior. Use every storage tool at your disposal to maximize

floor, wall and even rafter space for storage. Plan where items will be kept and customize the storage options around those locations.

Sheds can be an asset and improve storage capability in the backyard.
