The Screen Test program will be in Mayerthorpe in June to provide screening mammograms to eligible individuals aged 45 to 74.

Screening is available at no cost for eligible individuals, but appointments are required. Call 1-800-667-0604 to book an appointment or learn more about the program.

Individuals aged 45 to 74 can discuss their breast cancer risk with their healthcare providers to determine whether screening is appropriate for them and book with a radiology clinic or with Screen Test mobile mammography. CITY OF SPRUCE GROVE WILL NOT FUND ADDITIONAL EMS COST; PROVINCE TO LEAD SERVICE TRANSITION

Following careful review, Spruce Grove City Council voted Monday evening not to fund the additional cost associated with the provincial Ground Ambulance Service Agreement, a decision that will result in the transition away from the City's current integrated Fire-EMS service model.

"This has not been an easy discussion or debate, and it's not taken lightly by this Council," said Mayor Jeff Acker. "The ultimatum by the Province on integrated Fire-EMS service models was unfair to the City of Spruce Grove, to all other municipalities with integrated service models, and to other municipalities served by these integrated units. Fundamentally, health care is provincial jurisdiction, and it would neither be sustainable nor fiscally responsible for us, as a municipality, to subsidize provincial matters."

The Province has indicated it is working to standardize ground ambulance service delivery across Alberta, while stating that integrated models operate at a cost higher than comparable models elsewhere in Alberta. Council's decision aligns with the Province's direction while maintaining the City's principled position that health care funding is a provincial obligation.

"We are not in the business of absorbing open-ended provincial health care costs on behalf of local taxpayers, nor should we be," said Mayor Acker. "The Province has committed to maintaining service levels for our residents, and we take that commitment seriously."

Following the unanimous decision of Council not to fund out-of-jurisdiction provincial costs, Council put forward a motion to support and maintain Medical First Response (MFR) at an Advanced Life Support (ALS) level by Fire Services, providing timely medical aid to patients on-scene, as appropriate. A second motion directed City Administration to explore options for poten-

tially expanding MFR services in Spruce Grove's 2027-2029 Budget and Fiscal Plan. Both motions received unanimous Council support.

The current ambulance contract runs through September 2026. The Province has indicated it will collaborate with the City in developing a transition plan, and the City will engage fully with that process to ensure continuity of care for residents.

"There is no debate that the City has enjoyed the benefits of

an integrated model, and there is no questioning the professionalism, standard of care, and response that the leadership and members of Spruce Grove Fire Services have provided residents of the City and beyond under this model," said Fire Chief Chad Priebe. "This has not been, and is not being, disputed by EHS, City Administration, or City Council. In fact, the City has been celebrated for its service delivery, as have other integrated departments in Alberta."

The alternative option provided by the Province would have resulted in the City absorbing an additional cost of around \$1 million per year at the start, with projected annual increases after that. The City will provide further updates as the Province's transition plan takes shape. Visit sprucegrove.org for more information.

FARMERS' DAYS RODEO & EXHIBITION RETURNS WITH A WEEKEND OF TRADITION, COMMUNITY AND CELEBRATION

From rodeo and rides to parade and pancakes, the Farmers' Days Rodeo and Exhibition runs June 5 to 7 with three action-packed days of excitement and entertainment for all ages.

Presented in partnership with the Town of Stony Plain and the Kinsmen Club of Stony Plain, Farmers' Days is a long-standing, highly anticipated event marking the unofficial start of summer and features the Kinsmen Rodeo and Saloon, West Parkland Gas Co-op Parade, Mayor and Council Pancake Breakfast, midway rides, Kids Korral, and more than 160 indoor and outdoor market vendors.

"Farmers' Days is one of the community's largest annual events and something people look forward to year after year," says Mayor William Choy. "It brings people together and showcases the strong sense of community we have in Stony Plain. This event wouldn't be possible without the continued support and partnership of the Kinsmen Club of Stony Plain."

The fun kicks off Friday afternoon at 3 PM at Heritage Park, with midway rides, games and treats. The evening includes a free rodeo slack session – additional rodeo action outside the main performances – and the opening of the Kinsmen Saloon and outdoor market vendors.

Saturday starts early with the pancake breakfast from 7 to 9 AM at Glenn Hall Centennial Arena, followed by the parade at 10 AM. The five-kilometre parade, featuring colourful floats and live music, winds through downtown and surrounding areas and offers plenty of viewing locations along the way. Road closures will be in effect from 9 AM until noon.

Rodeo performances take place Saturday and Sunday, with classic events such as bull riding and barrel racing, plus fan favourites like mutton busting – kiddos, sheep and family fun.

"The rodeo continues to be a highlight of the weekend, giving people a chance to experience the energy up close, while the free Heavy Horse

Pull and Kids Korral give people even more to see and do," says Derek Roberts, Farmers' Day Chair for the Kinsmen Club of Stony Plain.

"With the size and scale of the event, a little planning goes a long way," says Jerry George, Programs and Services Manager for the Town of Stony Plain. "We encourage people to check schedules,

maps and parade route information, as well as take advantage of the free park-and-ride service to make getting around easier." As a reminder, there will be no parking available at Heritage Park or Stony Plain and Parkland Pioneer Museum, and free park-and-ride shuttles will run approximately every 30 minutes.

PARKLAND RCMP INVESTIGATION ULTIMATELY LEADS TO \$37.2 MILLION IN ILLICIT DRUG SEIZURES

In the spring of 2025, the Parkland RCMP detachment launched an investigation into the suspected drug trafficking of a Spruce Grove area woman. Through

investigative tools, including electronic and physical surveillance, members were able to monitor movement that quickly extended beyond the immediate area; first to Calgary, and then further east into Manitoba.

The Parkland RCMP

investigators solicited assistance of the Winnipeg Police Service (WPS) who ultimately determined the female suspect was associated to targets of their ongoing investigation dubbed Project PUMA. A traffic stop was initiated which

resulted in the seizure of 53 kilograms of methamphetamine and 5 kilograms of fentanyl.

In February of 2026, the WPS's Project PUMA investigators passed information along to the Parkland RCMP and Edmonton Police Service (EPS) resulting in a collaborative investigation that led to the seizure of 80 kilograms of cocaine in Edmonton.

"In this case, no single agency could have achieved this result alone. It required trust, timely information-sharing, and a willingness to hand off and support efforts across provincial and organizational boundaries," said Inspector Kevin McGilivray, Officer in Charge of the Parkland County RCMP. "It also highlights how a single investigation, when supported by strong partnerships, can have a much broader disruptive effect on organized crime networks, particularly where individuals play significant roles in trafficking and production."

The EPS and WPS have issued their own media releases outlining the seizures and arrests that have occurred in their jurisdictions.

- If paying through online banking, allow extra processing time before the due date.
