PARKLAND RCMP RESCUE STRANDED BOATERS ON DEVIL'S LAKE

On Jun. 3, 2026, at approximately 7:55 p.m., Parkland RCMP received a report of a disabled inflatable sport

boat on Devil's Lake, just East of Onoway. An adult male and two children were on board when the motor failed, leaving the vessel stranded in weeds.

The adult male was pre-

pared and made extensive efforts to restart the motor; however, once exhausting all available options they contacted police for assistance. Thanks to the

ALBERTA RCMP TRAFFIC – WHITECOURT UNIT ASSISTS WOODLANDS COUNTY AND ITS RESIDENTS

On May 11, 2026, an out-of-control wildfire broke out in Woodlands County, just Southeast of Whitecourt. At the time, the Whitecourt Traffic Unit was

actively engaged in National Road Safety Week, conducting enhanced traffic enforcement and education initiatives aimed at reducing unsafe driving practices.

As the wildfire escalated, the Traffic Unit quickly shift-

ed priorities to assist partner agencies with the evacuation of residents from over 100 homes. Members supported coordinated evacuation efforts to help ensure public safety during this critical incident.

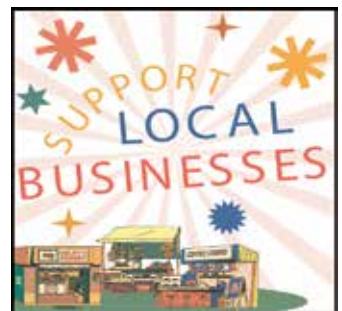
Parkland RCMP would like to advise the public that

detailed information provided by the caller, first responders were able to quickly deploy the detachment boat, locate the adult male and two children, and

safely rescue them without incident.

"Being prepared for emergencies on the water can make all the difference in getting home safely" says Corporal Cuneyt Zanbak of

the Parkland RCMP. "Have a plan, bring a charged cell phone and tell someone where you're going. In the event of an emergency, first responders will be able to locate you quickly."

A portion of Highway 43 was designated as a reduced speed zone to accommodate emergency operations. The Traffic Unit conducted high-visibility patrols to promote the safe and efficient movement of emergency personnel and equipment to and from the wildfire area.

During the response, Woodlands County staff identified concerns regarding the well-

being of pets and livestock left behind in the evacuation zone. In response, the Traffic Unit partnered with County staff and members of the Whitecourt RCMP Detachment to organize supplies and coordinate care efforts.

This initiative – named "The Paw Patrol" by County staff – saw members attend multiple residences to feed and water animals, including cats, dogs, horses, goats, and chickens.

"It was a very busy week for the Alberta RCMP Traffic – Whitecourt Unit as members balanced proactive enforcement with an unexpected emergency response" said Sgt. Greg Anderson of the Alberta RCMP Traffic-Whitecourt Unit. "We are always dedicated to the community and are glad to help, especially during times of need".

Parkland RCMP Responds To Vehicle Collision With Daycare

Though investigation is ongoing, initial information obtained by RCMP revealed that there were 18 children and 2 adults in the daycare. A female employee in her 20s was transported to hospital with non-life-threatening injuries. The driver of the full-size white van was in his 30s and was trans-

ported to hospital with non-life-threatening injuries.

“Our initial focus is on public safety. Now that the scene is stable, we will continue our investigation into the collision, including the actions of the driver leading up to the incident.” said Insp. Kevin McGillivray, Detachment Commander

of the Parkland RCMP. “We want to take this moment to thank the employees of the daycare for working so quickly to ensure the safety of the children in their care. The actions of these workers, as well as quick response from our partners at the Stony Plain Fire Department, were instrumental to ensuring the safety of

all involved.”

PARKLAND RCMP ARREST MALE FOR ASSAULT WITH A WEAPON

On May 17, 2026, at approximately 4:38 p.m., Parkland RCMP responded to a report of a stabbing in a parking lot near 70 McLeod Avenue in Spruce Grove. A male reported that two males were fighting when a third male intervened and

was stabbed in the back of the arm by one of the individuals involved. The suspect fled the area on foot.

Police located a 24-year-old male with a laceration to his arm. Patrols were conducted in the area to locate the suspect. Police later received a separate complaint from a mem-

ber of the public regarding the suspect and located him near Weston Drive in Spruce Grove, where he was located without incident.

Randall Copithorne, 39, a resident of Spruce Grove, was charged with the following offences:

•Assault,

- Assault while choking,
- Assault with a weapon,
- Possession of a weapon for a dangerous purpose x2.

Copithorne was brought before a Justice of the Peace and released on a Release Order with his next court date of June 10, 2026, at the Alberta Court of Justice in St. Albert.

WEED AND CROP INSPECTORS ARE ON THE JOB

A friendly reminder that Lac Ste. Anne County's annual crop and weed inspection program to prevent the spread of noxious and prohibited weeds is underway. The County has appointed nine weed and pest inspectors to conduct inspections from May through September.

During inspection season, the Agricultural Services team inspects all private and County properties for noxious and prohibited noxious weeds as per the Alberta Weed Control Act and the Alberta Agricultural Pests Act.

These inspectors will enforce and monitor compliance with regulations throughout the municipality. Residents are encouraged to report any weeds or pests to help benefit the agricultural community and uphold regulatory standards.

As always, inspection crews will exercise extreme care when entering fields to minimize any potential spread of crop issues from field to field. Precautions include the use of disposable boots and/or disinfection with a bleach solution prior to entering any field.

FIRE ADVISORY LIFTED FOR LAC STE. ANNE COUNTY

Please be advised that Lac Ste. Anne County Fire Services has rescinded the Fire Advisory, effective 8:30 am Tuesday, June 2, 2026. Recent moisture received and cooler temperatures have reduced the fire risk within the region.

There is now NO RESTRICTION in the County, and permit burning is allowed in accordance with bylaw and conditions imposed by County fire guardians. We will continue to monitor conditions and fire risk throughout the County and may update the fire safety status as warranted.

Fire behaviour is moderate, with initial spread indexes generally lower, due to recent moisture received and cooler temperatures. Residents are reminded that risk is still up anytime warm winds and afternoon sunshine are present. Overall, precautionary measures while burning are strongly advised.

Lac Ste. Anne County Fire Services sincerely thanks residents and visitors for their vigilance, patience, and compliance with the recent fire advisory and reminds all that we must always use caution and be responsible. Our behaviour is within our control; fire behaviour is not.

Fire Permits are allowed again in accordance to bylaw and conditions imposed by Fire Guardians. All permit conditions must be followed. Burning without a permit or outside of allowed conditions may result in fines, firefighting expenses, or worse: lost property and endangered lives.

DETOURS & DELAYS AHEAD DURING CONSTRUCTION SEASON

The County has several road and infrastructure projects in the works. These include some short-term projects as well as longer-term construction initiatives.

These projects are part of the County's ongoing efforts to enhance roadway safety, improve driving conditions, and respond to community feedback. More details will be shared as specific project timelines and locations are confirmed.

The following Public Works projects are currently or soon to be underway:

Dust Suppression Program:

This program has begun in Division 5—the Darwell area. Scheduled work will proceed east around Lac Ste. Anne (lake) then continue northwest through the County.

Summer Graveling Program:

You may notice graveling in areas to support the Dust Suppression Program, this may be done to ensure a road surface is best prepared for the suppressant application. The Summer Graveling Program will soon get underway, starting location yet to be determined.

Culvert Replacements:

This work is ongoing as deemed necessary. Please watch for alerts on the County's social media channels in advance of road closures and detours due to construction.

Road Closure Alert:

We're advising motorists of a full road closure of Twp Rd 574 A / 50 Avenue between Riverside Drive and Highway 43, west of Mayerthorpe. Due to the development of a small sinkhole this road will be closed until further notice.

This is a Bridge Project (BF 13468) that remains on schedule for replacement, with construction anticipated for this summer. The County apologizes for the inconvenience and appreciates the patience of affected motorists.

Construction season is here—please slow down, follow posted signs, and watch for workers. Your caution and diligence helps keep everyone safe.

ALBERTA RCMP ARREST MALE IN VEHICLE THEFT INVESTIGATION

Submitted by Alberta RCMP

On May 12, 2026, Parkland RCMP initiated an investigation into a series of vehicle thefts exhibiting similar patterns throughout Parkland County. The stolen property included multiple vehicles, including a white F350, a trailer, and several all-terrain vehicles.

Through investigative efforts, the Parkland RCMP Crime Reduction Unit (CRU) identified a male suspect linked to the incidents and began making attempts to locate him. On May 13, 2026, at approximately 10:05 a.m., Parkland RCMP received a report from the public regarding a suspicious white Ford F350 in the area of Range Road 25 in Stony Plain, Alta. Police located the vehicle and be-

gan surveillance; however, the suspect fled.

RCMP Real Time Communications Centre (RTOC), Parkland RCMP plain-clothes units, the Alberta RCMP Community Response Team (CRT), and RCMP Police Dog Services were all engaged in a coordinated response to mitigate the risk to public safety. The suspect continued to operate the vehicle in a highly erratic and dangerous manner, regardless of police presence.

Over the course of approximately two and a half hours, the vehicle was observed driving into on-coming lanes, including on Highway 16. The individual narrowly avoided multiple collisions with members of the public, driving at high rates of speed, through fences, farmers fields; and

ditches.

Police were eventually able to immobilize the vehicle. The suspect then exited and ran toward a dark grey Ford F150 in attempt to steal it. RCMP Emergency Response Team and Alberta RCMP CRT intervened, pinning the vehicle and preventing it from moving. The individual exited from the passenger side and attempted to flee on foot but was quickly arrested without further incident.

Brad Turlock, (34), a prolific offender of no fixed address, has been charged with multiple offences, including:

- Flight from Police;
- Dangerous operation of a motor vehicle;
- Have face disguised with intent to commit offence;
- Mischief over

\$5,000 damage to motor vehicle (x2); and

- Property obtained by crime \$5,000 (x6).

Brad Turlock has been remanded into custody with his next court appearance on June 3, 2026, at the Alberta Court of Justice in Edmonton.

“The behaviour we observed that day was an extraordinary risk to public safety. The individual continued driving erratically, regardless of whether police were in view or not,” said Sergeant Collin Kuca of the Parkland RCMP plain-clothes unit. “Our priority is to protect the public, and we took every measure available to bring the situation under control and ensure the individual was safely taken into custody.”

ONE CARD. THAT'S IT.

Starting July 2, driver's licences and ID cards will include your health number and citizenship marker – just one safe, secure card for the services you rely on.

Alberta government one card



Alberta's government is issuing new and renewed cards that will incorporate personal health numbers and Canadian citizenship markers. By combining identity, personal health numbers and citizenship information on one document, Albertans

will no longer need to carry multiple pieces of ID to access programs and services.

The new cards will feature a new modern design that is reflective of the province's rich history and identity. The new cards also include enhanced security features that will help protect against fraud. Over time, this transition will reduce and ultimately eliminate the need for paper Alberta Health Care cards.

“These redesigned cards are more than a visual update. They are a practical improvement that will make life easier for Albertans. The new features modernize Alberta's driver's licences and ID cards, making them more secure, more reliable and more useful for everyday service access. Having one secure card is a practical improve-

ment that will better serve Albertans now and into the future.”

Dale Nally, Minister of Service Alberta and Red Tape Reduction

Albertans applying for or renewing a driver's licence or ID card will need to show proof they are legally entitled to be in Canada. Those who confirm Canadian citizenship will have a citizenship marker added to their card. Eligible non-citizens can still obtain a licence or ID card, and a one-time 60-day grace period may be available for Albertans needing additional time to obtain the required documents.

“These new cards will make accessing services simpler and more convenient for eligible Albertans. By integrating personal health numbers into driver's licences and ID

cards, we are streamlining access to health services and improving how information connects across the system, making care more efficient and responsive for Albertans.”

To add the personal health number onto their card, eligible Albertans must bring their Alberta Health Care card, valid ID and proof of legal entitlement when applying for or renewing a driver's licence or ID card. Registry agents will verify Alberta Health Care eligibility in person, including for dependent family members. Once this process is complete, the personal health numbers will be added to the licence or ID card.

PARKLAND RCMP ATTEND FATAL MOTOR VEHICLE COLLISION

On May 28, 2026 at approximately 2:42 a.m., Parkland RCMP responded to complaints of a 2 vehicle collision on Highway 16 westbound near the Highway 60 over-

pass. Upon attendance with the Parkland RCMP Reconstruction Unit, investigation determined that a grey Dodge Durango was travelling westbound on the highway when it struck a stationary scissor lift work platform.

The driver of the Dodge Durango, a 44-year-old male resident of Spruce Grove, Alta; was pronounced deceased on scene. The construction worker who was in the bucket of the scissor lift was transported to hospital by EMS with serious

injuries.

Both west and eastbound lanes of Highway 16 are currently closed and being diverted to the off ramps.

ELECTIONS ALBERTA LAUNCHES LARGEST RECRUITMENT DRIVE IN ALBERTA'S HISTORY

Today, Elections Alberta is launching the largest electoral event worker recruitment campaign in Alberta's history and one of the largest referendum recruitment efforts ever undertaken in Canada ahead of the province's upcoming referendum on October 19, 2026.

With ten ballot questions, Elections Alberta will print 45 million ballots, far exceeding the 1.8 million ballots cast in Alberta's 2023 provincial general election and the 19.8 million ballots cast in Canada's 2025 federal general election.

To achieve the 48-hour deadline to complete the unofficial ballot count, a minimum of 60,000 workers will be required.

"I especially encourage rural Albertans to apply. Delivering a referendum of this scale will require dedicated election workers in every corner of our province," McClure added.

Seeking to recruit more than 60,000 workers for the upcoming referendum

All Alberta residents 16 years or older and eligible to work in Canada are welcome to apply. Some positions will require applicants to be 18 years or older, all election workers will need to pass a criminal history check, and election

workers will be unable to participate in any political activity during their employment. Elections Alberta is a non-partisan, independent Office of the Legislature, and all election officers must sign an oath requiring them to uphold the non-partisan mandate of the Office during the Referendum.

For day-to-day operations, Elections Alberta is staffed by 48 permanent staff. This expands significantly during election periods.

During the 2023 Alberta provincial general election, Elections Alberta hired 13,095 election workers, with the total cost for the election coming to approximately \$37 million.

Recruiting more than 60,000 workers for the upcoming referendum is no small task. For context, the 1995 Quebec referendum required the recruitment of 57,000 electoral workers to assist the 4.8 million voters and manage polling stations.

Interested Albertans can apply online at <https://recruitment.elections.ab.ca/8400/8>.

Applicants are encouraged to apply early and should apply separately for each role they are interested in. Successful applicants will begin to be notified starting in mid-July.

Applications will be directed to the Returning Officer for the applicant's electoral division based on their residential address. Applicants may also be asked to work in electoral divisions adjacent to where they live.

Applicants are asked to be patient due to the large volume of roles being recruited for and applications received. Only selected candidates will be contacted. Please do not contact Elections Alberta to inquire about the status of your application.

About the positions

Positions will include Election Officers who staff the voting places and Counting Officers who are responsible for vote-counting once voting places close.

A variety of roles are available including:

- Site Supervisors,
- Information Officers,
- Voting Officers,
- Ballot Box Clerks,
- Registration Officers,
- Record Clerks,
- Count Supervisors,
- Count Coordinators, and
- Count Officers.

All positions are paid, and the time commitment varies depending on the role. Some positions will begin October 13, with paid training scheduled in early October prior to the position start date. The training will involve a mix

of online and in-person, depending on the role.

Applications from rural Albertans are especially encouraged to help support referendum administration and vote counting across the province.

Positions are available for the following periods:

- Advance Voting – October 13 - 17, 2026,
- Election Day – October 19, 2026, and
- Counting Ballots – October 19 - 21, 2026.

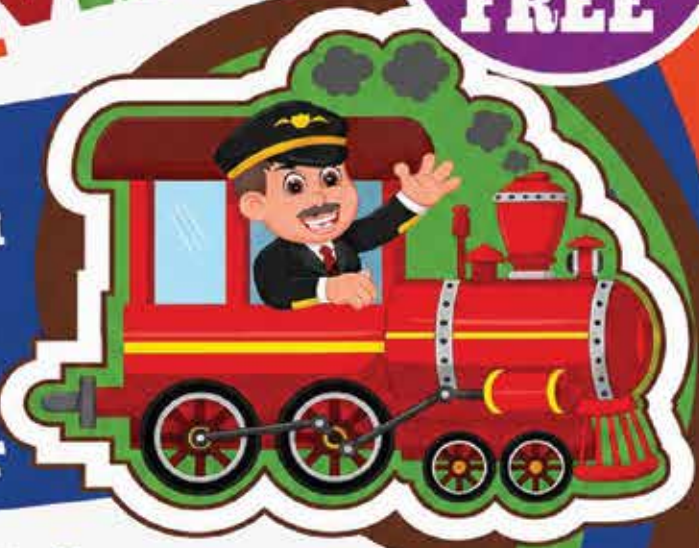
