Alberta's government is launching the Alberta En-

ergy Rebate, turning energy revenues into money directly in Albertans' pockets.

Beginning July 1, 2026,

nearly 3.4 million Albertans will be eligible to receive \$100 through the new Alberta Energy

# Putting Energy Revenues Back In Your Pocket

Rebate. The Energy Rebate will put tax dollars collected over recent months of elevated gas prices back in the hands of Albertans to help with the costs of fuel and other household needs. With this rebate, the government is delivering more savings with more flexibility, to meet the challenges families are facing today.

Rather than relying on fuel tax relief and hoping that savings are passed on through lower prices, this approach will ensure elevated oil revenues deliver real benefits to Albertans - benefits that don't disappear at the pumps.

"Higher oil prices don't just affect what people

pay at the pump, they can increase the cost of groceries, utilities and other household expenses. The Alberta Energy Rebate turns higher energy revenues into direct relief for Albertans, giving families the flexibility to use it where they need it most."

Danielle Smith, Premier Alberta residents who are 18 or older, have filed a 2025 tax return and have a household income of \$225,000 or less, will be eligible to apply for the Energy Rebate through a secure online portal starting on July 1, 2026. A household is defined as a single individual or two individuals who are married or in a common-law relationship.

When the federal govern-

ment suspended its 10-cent fuel excise tax earlier this year, those savings were erased at the pumps within days, and before Albertans could feel any relief. The Energy Rebate gives Albertans real returns now on the higher oil prices of previous months - delivering families more than 50 per cent in additional savings, on average, than what the fuel tax relief program was projected to provide over the next three months.

"When oil prices are high, everyone feels it. Albertans deserve real relief and the freedom to use it when and where it matters most to their families. The Alberta Energy Rebate delivers exactly that with

Whether the priority is groceries, bills, rent or fuel, the Energy Rebate ensures flexible support. With guaranteed support for every eligible Albertan – driver or not – eligible two-adult households will receive \$200 in immediate relief that can be used for any household need. Families may also benefit from additional \$100 rebates with each eligible adult family member or child aged 18 or older living in the same home.

The rebate also ensures support reaches seniors, vulnerable populations, transit users, remote workers and others who may not have benefited from fuel relief. Those receiving the Alberta Seniors Benefit and individuals enrolled in Assured Income for the Severely Handicapped (AISH), the Alberta Disability Assistance Program (ADAP) and Income Support will be automatically enrolled to receive their payment.

“We know affordability is top of mind for Albertans – we hear you, and we are taking action. This rebate builds on our existing affordability measures, delivering broader, flexible support to ensure Alberta remains the most affordable place to live, work and raise a family.”

The Alberta Energy Rebate adds to the measures

and programs that make Alberta one of the most affordable places in Canada to live, work and raise a family. On top of having the second-lowest taxes on fuel in the country at 13 cents per litre, Alberta’s competitive, low-tax environment has helped keep the average fuel price at 156.3 cents per litre, well below the Canadian average of 171.2 cents per litre. Albertans also benefit from the lowest personal income taxes and no provincial sales tax. Alberta’s

government also introduced an eight per cent tax bracket last year, saving Albertans about \$1.2 billion in 2025.

# STRENGTHENING SUPPORT FOR CAREGIVERS

Alberta's government is investing \$3.1 million to increase rates for foster, kinship and permanency caregivers, and strengthening existing supports.

Effective April 1, 2026, foster, kinship and permanency caregivers received a two per cent rate increase to help cover day-to-day necessities like food, clothing and personal care. Caregiver referral incentives will be tripled to \$1,500, starting June 16. Eligibility for the Refer-A-Foster Caregiver program is being expanded beyond current and former foster caregivers to include kinship and permanency caregivers, as well as

non-profit organizations such as cultural associations, faith-based and community groups.

"I am grateful to the compassionate and dedicated caregivers across Alberta who open their homes and hearts to children and youth when they need them the most. By strengthening the caregiver program, we are helping ensure more children and youth have access to the stable, loving homes they deserve. I hope that more Albertans will consider becoming caregivers."

Alberta is also strengthening support for prospective caregivers to recognize their commitment to the

process required to become licensed caregivers. Applicants will receive \$1,500 in two instalments: \$450 after completing pre-service training and \$1,050 once they are fully licensed.

"Alberta Foster and Kinship Association appreciates the Government of Alberta's continued recognition of the important role foster and kinship caregivers play in supporting children and youth. This increase will help manage rising costs and support caregivers to continue to provide safe, stable and nurturing homes for children and youth who cannot remain at home with their families."

Alberta is launching a new online portal to give caregivers secure access to information and services including the ability to submit claims online, informed by feedback gathered during the 2024 roundtable discussions with kinship and foster caregivers.

Budget 2026 focuses on what matters, makes disciplined choices and takes decisive action. This includes an increase to Children and Family Services of more than five per cent from Budget 2025 - to make sure children are safe and those fleeing violence are supported.

# PARKLAND RCMP INVESTIGATE REAR END COLLISION INVOLVING MOTORCYCLE

# STRENGTHENING CANCER CARE FOR ALBERTANS

Alberta is strengthening cancer care with earlier breast cancer screening and a program to help patients preserve fertility and build a family after treatment.

Alberta's government is expanding free breast cancer screening to all women aged 40 and older and is providing \$2.25 million to Cancer Care Alberta, in partnership with Fertility Alberta, to create a new oncofertility program to support cancer patients facing urgent fertility decisions.

One in two Albertans will be diagnosed with cancer in

their lifetime. Through earlier screening, cancer can be identified sooner, when lifesaving treatment is most effective. Preserving fertility ensures treatment does not take away a future beyond diagnosis, including the choice to build a family.

"The word cancer changes a life in an instant. In that moment, families are forced to make difficult decisions no one can prepare for. By expanding screening and supporting fertility preservation, we're making sure Albertans have real options, real support, and the chance to plan for a future beyond their diagnosis."

New Oncofertility Program

The program is expected to benefit 250-400 patients annually and builds on the provincewide oncofertility pathway introduced in 2025, which improved standardized screening and streamlined referrals to

fertility clinics for patients who may want to have children after treatment.

It addresses a key gap by adding financial support for faster access to urgent fertility consultations, so patients can make critical decisions before treatment begins. This innovative program brings together care, funding and navigation to ensure patients can act quickly with the peace of mind that their future fertility is protected and focus on treatment.

The program will be fully developed and implemented in 2026-27, with more information on eligibility and how to access supports to be

"I was diagnosed with breast cancer at 32 years old. I know first-hand how overwhelming those first few days are after a diagnosis. Expanding breast cancer screening

Beginning April 1, 2027, all women aged 40 and older will be able to self-refer for breast cancer screening without a physician referral. In the interim, women aged 40 to 44 can access free screening with a one-time physician referral, while women aged 45 and older can continue to self-refer.

Breast cancer is the most common cancer affecting Alberta women. This expansion will make more than 193,000 additional women eligible for breast cancer screening, helping detect cancer earlier, often before symptoms appear, when treatment is most effective.

"Mammography is a safe and effective screening tool for early cancer detection. This policy change will save lives, reinforcing Alberta's long-standing leadership in breast cancer screening, and improving outcomes for women across the province."

Alberta is set for the 2026 wildfire season with trained crews and prepared equipment in place.

The province has hired more than 550 seasonal firefighters for this wildfire season and has access to hundreds more through contracts and mutual aid agreements should they be needed.

“Protecting our communities, forests and critical infrastructure from the threats of wildfire is a top priority for Alberta’s government. We’re taking action so Albertans, our municipal partners and our communities can feel safer and more prepared during the 2026 wildfire season. Through partnerships, education, risk reduction and the use of new technology, we’re using all available tools to create a more wildfire-resilient Alberta.”

Crews are prepared to respond to wildfires anywhere in the province. They are trained for both quick response and long-term firefighting, and new partnerships will bolster wildfire mitigation and response to keep Albertans safe.

Alberta’s government con-

tinues to invest in improved air attack capabilities to better support crews on the ground. This includes helicopters with night-vision capability for around-the-clock aerial support, and hoist-equipped helicopters that can safely move firefighters into and out of difficult-to-reach terrain.

“Alberta’s government has been meticulous in their work in wildfire response. They understood early on what the CL-215-T could do, and they built their aerial suppression program around it. When a fire breaks out here, those aircraft are in the air fast, scooping from the nearest lake and dropping before the fire has a chance to establish itself. That is the advantage. It is not just the aircraft, it is the fact that Alberta has them, they are maintained, the crews know them, and they are ready. That kind of readiness is what keeps a small fire from becoming a disaster.”

In March, Alberta announced a \$400-million contract with De Havilland Canada for five new, made-in-Alberta water-bombers. Together these tools will improve safety, effectiveness and coordination between air and ground crews.

Alberta also has a network of airbases across the province that allow aircraft to be deployed where they are needed most. Partnerships with communities and air-

strips are essential to getting these resources in the air where and when they needed to be.

That’s why we’re investing in the training they need to respond safely and effectively, because strong local fire services are the backbone of our wildfire defence, and we’re making sure they have the tools and skills to protect the people they serve”

New this year, Alberta is introducing the Mutual Aid Incentive Pilot for the 2026 wildfire season. The program offers municipalities up to \$125,000 to support wildfire response and encourages them to ask for provincial assistance sooner. With wildfires becoming more frequent and severe, the costs of responding to wildfires is significant for all levels of government, including Alberta’s municipalities. This new pilot program will lower financial barriers that may have delayed mutual aid requests in the past and help reduce the immediate cost concerns for municipalities.

“The Mutual Aid Incentive Pilot is the kind of program that makes a real difference at the municipal level. With up to \$125,000 dedicated to wildfire response, we can act decisively the moment a fire threatens our community. Sturgeon County sits in a landscape that demands we

move fast, and this program empowers us to do exactly that while strengthening the provincial-municipal partnership that protects Alberta”

Alberta’s government will continue to rely on the expanded Wildland Urban Interface teams made up of specially trained municipal firefighters, to provide an added line of defence for communities and critical infrastructure threatened by wildfires. This work builds on other municipal-level wildfire mitigation and resilience measures, such as community fireguards, FireSmart programs, and the Community Hazardous Fuels Reduction Program.

Our government has taken lessons from previous events to strengthen mitigation, preparedness and response. # NEW PROVINCIAL DNA LAB: FAST-TRACKING JUSTICE

Submitted by Government of Alberta

Budget 2026 is investing \$8.9 million to build Western Canada's first provincial forensic DNA laboratory to speed up investigations and support prosecutions.

Once operational, the Alberta forensic DNA laboratory will help reduce wait times and allow police to identify suspects sooner, supporting prosecutors in building stronger cases and helping victims get answers faster. The lab will also reduce the cost of DNA testing paid by municipalities and allow police to submit more evidence from property crimes for testing, helping solve offences that often affect rural communities.

DNA testing allows police to identify suspects by comparing biological evidence, such as blood, hair or saliva, found at crime scenes. Currently, most DNA evidence collected by police officers must be sent to a federal laboratory, often resulting in months-long wait times that can slow investigations and delay court proceedings.

"Alberta will no longer outsource our public safety to Ottawa. This new lab means faster testing and quicker turnaround times. Victims shouldn't have to wait years for closure while

evidence sits on a shelf in another province. We are bringing DNA testing home to Alberta to speed up prosecutions, protect our communities and ensure that justice is served at the speed Albertans expect."

Following renovations later this year, the laboratory will be located within the Alberta Law Enforcement Response Teams (ALERT) facility in Sherwood Park. It will open in phases to ensure operational readiness and that testing procedures meet international accreditation standards. By 2029, it is expected to begin accepting DNA evidence from property crimes, such as break-ins and thefts. By 2031, services are expected to expand to include serious crimes, such as ho-

micides and sexual assaults.

Alberta sends more DNA evidence for testing than any other province. In 2024-25, each DNA test cost about \$2,482 when processed through the federal system. With a provincial lab, Alberta expects the average cost per case to be up to 40 per cent lower, helping reduce costs for municipalities and taxpayers.

To help offset operating costs, Alberta's government intends to negotiate a new funding arrangement with the federal government, similar to agreements already in place in Ontario and Quebec. Under this model, Alberta's forensic DNA laboratory could operate at net-zero cost to provincial taxpayers by 2031.

Budget 2026 focuses on what matters, makes disciplined choices and takes decisive action.

## UPDATE: ASSESSMENT REVIEW PROCESS AND DEADLINES

The Assessment & Taxation department is currently assisting with a high number of assessment-related questions. We appreciate the community's patience and understanding as staff work diligently to respond to inquiries in the order they are received. **Please note that the County may not be able to respond to all inquiries by June 30.**

Property owners who believe their property value may be inaccurate are encouraged to submit a formal Assessment Complaint. Filing a complaint ensures your concerns are reviewed through the legislated process and preserves your right to an independent review, regardless of inquiry response times.

Information about the Assessment Complaint process is available on our website's Assessment & Taxation page. The complaint form and supporting resources can be downloaded directly from there.

### Property Tax Information:

- Property Taxes are due June 30, 2026
- Any approved assessment revision will be reflected in your tax account once the review process is complete.

- Property owners are encouraged to pay their current tax balance by the due date to avoid penalties.
- A 9% penalty will be applied to unpaid taxes beginning July 1, regardless of any ongoing assessment review.

### Property Tax Payment Options:

- Property Taxes may be paid in person at the County Administration Office;
- Via online banking; or
- Online through OptionPay - online payment platform available on our website
- Check the back of your Property Tax & Assessment Notice for further payment methods

### Complaint Fee Payment Options

- The Complaint fee may be paid in person at the County Administration Office; or
- Online through OptionPay

If an assessment review results in an overpayment of taxes, the overpayment may be refunded upon written request or applied as a credit toward future taxes.

**Property taxes remain due June 30, 2026. Submitting an assessment inquiry or complaint does not extend tax payment deadlines. Property owners are encouraged to pay their current tax balance by the due date to avoid penalties. Any approved assessment changes will be reflected in the tax account once the review process is complete.**

## RACCOONS EXPANDING THEIR RANGE IN ALBERTA

### [LSAC.ca/agriculture/problem-wildlife](https://www.lsac.ca/agriculture/problem-wildlife)

Traditionally found in southern Alberta, raccoons are expanding their range and have been spotted in more central and northern parts of the province. Highly adaptable and intelligent, these animals can thrive in a variety of environments and eat almost anything, including insects, fruits, eggs, grain, garden vegetables, bird seed, pet food, and garbage. Their ability to take advantage of human food source has helped them establish themselves in new areas.

While raccoons are generally shy and most active at night, they can become a nuisance when food and shelter are readily available. Residents may encounter overturned garbage bins, raided gardens, or raccoons seeking shelter beneath decks, sheds, and other structures. The best way to discourage unwanted visits is to secure garbage and compost bins, avoid leaving pet food outdoors, and clean up fallen fruit and bird seed.

Raccoons may also carry diseases such as raccoon roundworm, canine distemper, or leptospirosis. Avoid areas where raccoons may have been present, and report any animals showing unusual behaviour.

As Alberta's wildlife populations continue to adapt to changing landscapes, sightings of species such as raccoons are becoming more common in areas where they once rarely seen. By reducing attractants and giving wildlife plenty of space, residents, can help ensure safe coexistence for both people and animals.

If you're dealing with problematic raccoons, there are ways the County can help. Contact the Agricultural Services team to get started.
