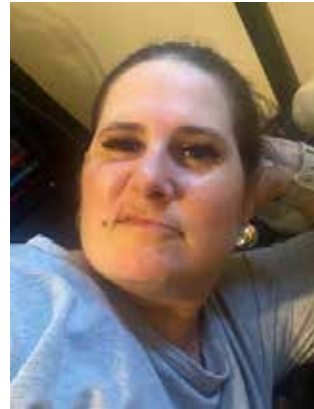

PUTTING ENERGY REVENUES BACK IN YOUR POCKET

Submitted by Government of Alberta

Alberta's government is launching the Alberta Energy Rebate, turning energy revenues into money directly in Albertans' pockets.

Beginning July 1, 2026, nearly 3.4 million Albertans will be eligible to receive \$100 through the new Alberta Energy Rebate. The Energy Rebate will put tax dollars collected over recent months of elevated gas prices back in the hands of Albertans to help with the costs of fuel and other household needs. With this rebate, the government is delivering more savings with more flexibility, to meet the challenges families are facing today.

Rather than relying on fuel tax relief and hoping

that savings are passed on through lower prices, this approach will ensure elevated oil revenues deliver real benefits to Albertans - benefits that don't disappear at the pumps.

"Higher oil prices don't just affect what people pay at the pump, they can increase the cost of groceries, utilities and other household expenses. The Alberta Energy Rebate turns higher energy revenues into direct relief for Albertans, giving families the flexibility to use it where they need it most."

Danielle Smith, Premier Alberta residents who are 18 or older, have filed a 2025 tax return and have a household income of \$225,000 or less, will be eligible to apply for the Energy Rebate through a secure online por-

tal starting on July 1, 2026. A household is defined as a single individual or two individuals who are married or in a common-law relationship.

When the federal government suspended its 10-cent fuel excise tax earlier this year, those savings were erased at the pumps within days, and before Albertans could feel any relief. The Energy Rebate gives Albertans real returns now on the higher oil prices of previous months - delivering families more than 50 per cent in additional savings, on average, than what the fuel tax relief program was projected to provide over the next three months.

"When oil prices are high, everyone feels it. Albertans deserve real relief and the freedom to use it when and

where it matters most to their families. The Alberta Energy Rebate delivers exactly that with reliable support for more Albertans across the province."

Whether the priority is groceries, bills, rent or fuel, the Energy Rebate ensures flexible support. With guaranteed support for every eligible Albertan - driver or not - eligible two-adult households will receive \$200 in immediate relief that can be used for any household need. Families may also benefit from additional \$100 rebates with each eligible adult family member or child aged 18 or older living in the same home.



The rebate also ensures support reaches seniors, vulnerable populations, transit users, remote workers and others who may not have benefited from fuel relief. Those receiving the Alberta Seniors Benefit and individuals enrolled in Assured Income for the Severely Handicapped (AISH), the Al-

berta Disability Assistance Program (ADAP) and Income Support will be automatically enrolled to receive their payment.

“We know affordability is top of mind for Albertans – we hear you, and we are taking action. This rebate builds on our existing affordability measures, delivering broader, flexible support to ensure

Alberta remains the most affordable place to live, work and raise a family.”

The Alberta Energy Rebate adds to the measures and programs that make Alberta one of the most affordable places in Canada to live, work and raise a family. On top of having the second-lowest

taxes on fuel in the country at 13 cents per litre, Alberta’s competitive, low-tax environment has helped keep the average fuel price at 156.3 cents per litre, well below the Canadian average of 171.2 cents per litre. Albertans also benefit from the lowest personal income taxes and no provincial sales tax. Alberta’s government also introduced an eight per cent tax bracket last year, saving Albertans about \$1.2 billion in 2025.

Alberta’s government is focused on delivering direct, practical relief people can count on. Should oil prices remain elevated over future quarters, Alberta’s government will explore the best options for delivering relief and easing the pressure for Alberta families.

Nominations are now open for the Alberta Community Justice Awards, recognizing the people and organizations helping make communities safer.

Held every two years, the Alberta Community Justice Awards shine a spotlight on unsung heroes including individuals, teams and organizations working tirelessly to prevent crime and make Alberta safer

and more resilient. From police officers and lawyers to victim advocates and youth volunteers, the awards celebrate Albertans whose leadership and service saves lives and strengthens communities.

This year, the program has expanded with new categories recognizing those dedicated to offender rehabilitation and emergency preparedness, reflecting the many different ways Albertans can support public safety and recognizing the ded-

icated individuals and teams striving to build a safer Alberta. Recipients will be honoured this fall at an awards ceremony in Lethbridge co-hosted by Alberta's government, the Lethbridge Police Service and the Lethbridge Chamber of Commerce.

Bylaw 06-2026 Amendments to Bylaw 05-2025 Summer Village of Seba Beach Land Use Bylaw

The Summer Village of Seba Beach Council will consider the following amendment:

9.1 ACCESSORY BUILDINGS AND USES

9.1.2 In residential districts, all accessory buildings, including detached garages and guest houses (garage suites and garden suites) shall be located according to the following:

d. An accessory building shall not be more than 9.0 m (29.5 ft.) 4.5 m (14.8 ft.) in height, unless it is a garage suite on the second floor over a garage, in which case the accessory building shall not exceed 9.0 m (29.5 ft.) in height.

Hearing Procedure

This is a formal Public Hearing and Council is prepared to hear and receive formal submissions and presentations (verbal or written) from those who wish to speak to the proposed Bylaw. New Ad Hoc Committee: To support this initiative, the Board's new Ad Hoc Committee for Fulham's agriculture program will officially begin meeting in August. These meetings will be held monthly at the school to ensure the program's collaborative success. Spotlight on Students

École Westhaven's Recess Project: Principal Janaya Marshall was all smiles as two of her stellar Grade 4 students hit it out of the park with a fantastic presentation. The students shared details about the school's new Recess Project, a wonderful initiative led by student leaders in collaboration with the school's Family School Liaison Counselors to foster positive, inclusive play.

Board Inquiries - At a Glance

PROVINCEWIDE CRACKDOWN ON ORGANIZED CRIME

Submitted by Government of Alberta

Alberta's government is investing nearly \$8 million to strengthen the fight against organized crime, extortion and gang activity across the province.

Organized crime threatens Alberta families, businesses and communities through extortion, intimidation, violence and gang activity. This targeted investment will support frontline and specialized law enforcement agencies

in purchasing modern tools to investigate, disrupt and dismantle organized criminal networks, improving safety in urban, rural and remote communities across Alberta.

This funding will also strengthen enforcement efforts and coordination across municipal, provincial and federal agencies targeting organized crime operating across jurisdictional boundaries.

As part of the investment, Alberta's government is providing nearly \$8 million in one-time grant

funding to the Edmonton Police Service, Calgary Police Service, Alberta RCMP and Alberta Law Enforcement Response Teams (ALERT). The funding will support specialized investigative resources and tools including surveillance, intelligence and digital forensic equipment, all devoted to respond to increasingly complex organized crime activity.

The funding will also enhance law enforcement efforts to stop extortion targeting members of the South Asian business commu-

STRENGTHENING SURGICAL CARE IN ALBERTA

Submitted by Government of Alberta

Alberta is expanding surgical capacity and modernizing funding to improve access to timely procedures for patients across the province.

Alberta's government is investing \$809 million to strengthen surgical services by increasing operating room availability, expanding the use of chartered surgical facilities,

and upgrading hospital infrastructure. With this investment the first phase of patient-focused funding implementation will begin to modernize how surgeries are delivered and funded.

Patient-focused funding will tie the number of patients treated to hospital funding, taking into consideration the complexity of care provided. This ensures funding follows the patient rather than traditional block funding, helping im-

prove access to surgery and reducing wait times for procedures that can significantly enhance quality of life.

First announced last year, the initial phase of patient-focused funding is now in place across 12 hospitals, applying to high-volume procedures, such as hip and knee replacements, cataract surgeries and select shoulder procedures.

Patient-focused funding has been introduced gradually in other jurisdictions over several years, including the U.K., Germany, Australia and Norway. In these cases, implementation occurred in successive stages as impacts were assessed so systems could adapt. In Alberta, future phases will be introduced following careful assessment of early results, supporting a stable and measured transition to a model that works for patients and the health system.

Through Budget 2026, Alberta is investing \$525 million over three years in the Acute Care Action Plan. This will support up to 50,000 additional surgeries by expanding operating room capacity in public hospitals and increasing the use of chartered surgical facilities for lower-complexity procedures. This will help free up hospital capacity for more complex cases, which will reduce wait times and improve patient flow.

In addition, Alberta is investing \$284 million over three years through the Alberta Surgical Initiative Capital Program to renovate operating rooms, upgrade surgical infrastructure and purchase new equipment in publicly owned hospitals. These investments will improve efficiency and expand long-term surgical capacity across the system.

Alberta completed a record number of surgeries last fiscal year, performing 332,847 procedures and exceeding both its annual target and the previous year's total. Surgical volumes continued to climb throughout the year, reaching a record-high monthly total of 24,676 surgeries in March 2026. Alberta's government is continuing to build on that momentum to ensure Albertans receive care within clinically recommended timelines.

Together, these initiatives strengthen Alberta's publicly funded health care system by expanding capacity, modernizing infrastructure and improving how surgical care is delivered.
