WATER QUALITY ADVISORY ISSUED FOR ALBERTA BEACH ON LAC STE. ANNE

Due to elevated levels of bacteria, Alberta Health Services (AHS) is advising the public not to swim or wade at this beach area on Lac Ste. Anne, effective immediately.

Elevated levels of bacteria were detected via testing of the lake water at this beach location. At current levels, gastrointestinal illness may result from ingestion of the water at Alberta Beach. There is also the

possibility of skin, ear and eye infections with water contact.

As always, visitors and residents are reminded to never drink or cook with untreated water directly from any body of water, including Lac Ste. Anne, at any time. Water-borne organisms, including fecal bacteria, can cause vomiting and diarrhea.

This advisory will remain in effect until further notice.

Statement from the Commanding Officer of the Alberta RCMP,

The RCMP has carriage of the investigation into

the alleged misuse of the list of Alberta electors and is uniquely positioned to seamlessly engage investigative resources at the local, provincial, national or international level as re-

quired.

We appreciate the significant public interest surrounding this investigation – the apparent inappropriate release of your personal information is of great concern

to the public and to the RCMP. However, the RCMP's primary responsibility must be to protect the integrity of the investigation and therefore are limited on details that we can share publicly, including confirming comments made by third parties.

With respect to this investigation we recognize there is a lot of public commentary, however we encourage the public to rely on official statements released by the RCMP.

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STRENGTHENING FAMILY VIOLENCE RESPONSE

Alberta invests in a new program to improve access to targeted supports for Albertans experiencing family violence.

Albertans deserve access to help they can rely on during a crisis. Through the new Emergency Family Violence Services program, Alberta's government is investing almost \$62 million to improve access to supports and services for Albertans when and where they need them the most.

Over the past two years, Alberta's government has had many opportunities to meet with service providers to discuss their concerns and challenges. The new program reflects what we have heard from our partners through these engagements: people experiencing family violence need access to flexible supports in places they feel safest, whether that is at home, in their community or in a shelter. The Emergency Family Violence Services program establishes a needs-based funding allocation approach which would help address service demand and capacity concerns, define core emergency family violence services and encourage regional collaboration

and innovation across the province.

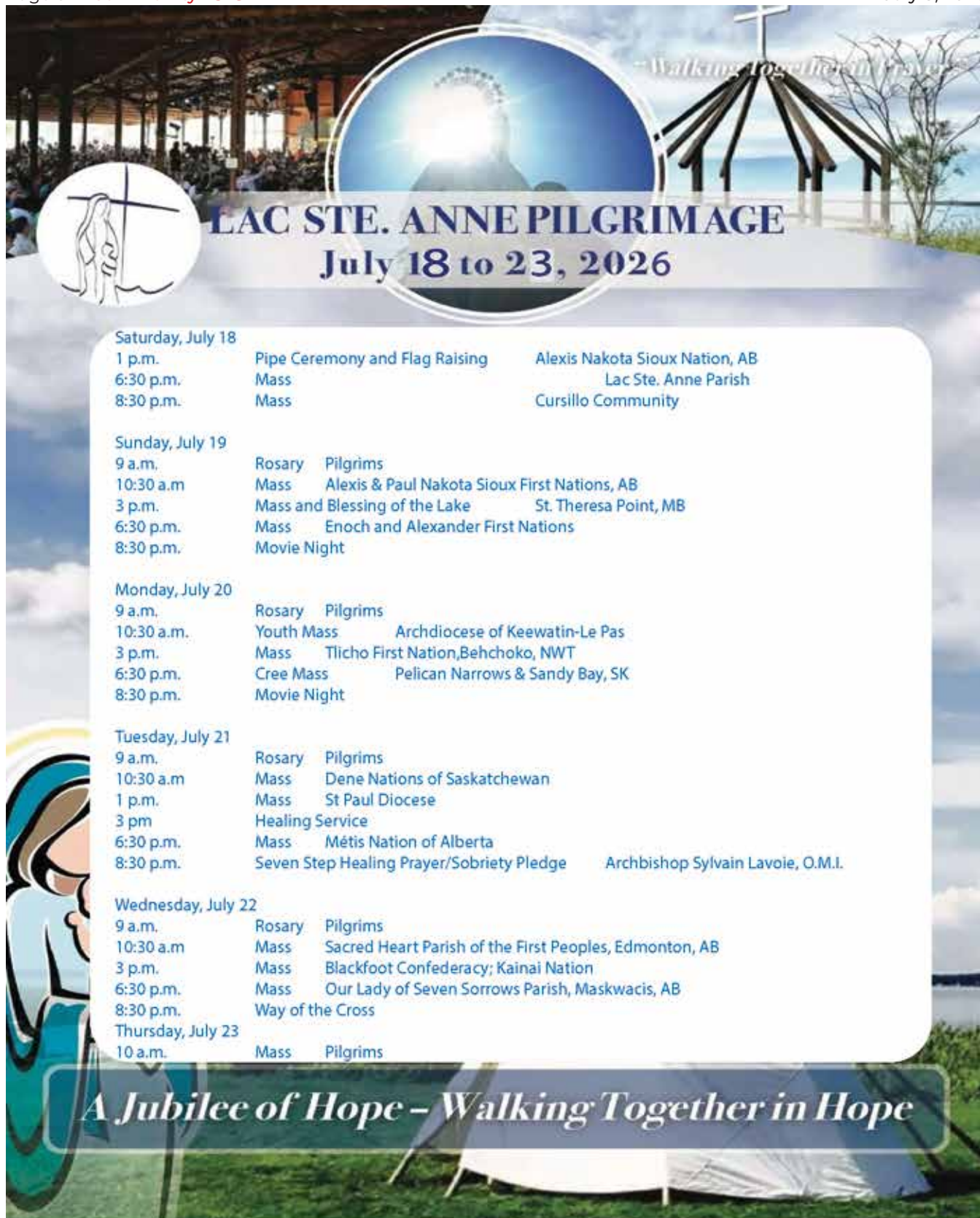

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CYANOBACTERIAL (BLUE-GREEN ALGAL) BLOOM ADVISORY ISSUED FOR LAC STE. ANNE & ISLE LAKES

Submitted by AHS

A cyanobacterial (blue-green algal) bloom and/or toxins have been identified in the waters of Lac Ste. Anne. Residents living near the shores of this lake, as well as visitors, are advised to take the following precautions:

- Do not swim or wade in any areas where cyanobacterial blooms are visible.

- Avoid all contact with cyanobacterial blooms in the water and washed up on shore. Wash with clean tap water as soon as possible if contact occurs.

- Do not drink or cook with water from this lake.

- Do not eat whole fish or fish trimmings from this lake as fish may store toxins in their liver. Fish fillets contain less toxins and are safer to eat.

- Keep pets away from the water. Do not allow pets to swim in areas where cyanobacterial blooms are visible or to contact blooms in the water or on the shore.

- Do not feed whole fish or fish trimmings from this lake to your pets.

As always, visitors and residents are reminded to never drink or cook with untreated water directly from any body of water, including Lac Ste. Anne, at any time. Boiling of this water will not remove the toxins produced by cyanobacteria. An alternate source of drinking water should also be provided for pets and livestock while this advisory is active.

Cyanobacteria are naturally occurring and large growths called 'blooms' are more common during warm weather. Cyanobacterial blooms can be blue-green, greenish-brown, brown, pink and/or red, and can look like scum, streaks,

grass clippings, fuzz balls, paint or pea soup. They often smell musty or grassy.

People who come in contact with a cyanobacterial bloom or who ingest water containing cyanobacteria may experience skin irritation, rash, sore throat, sore red eyes, swollen lips, fever, nausea and vomiting and/or diarrhea. Symptoms

can appear within one to three hours and resolve in one to two days. Symptoms in children are often more pronounced; however, all people are at risk of these symptoms. Exposure to cyanobacteria may be fatal to pets.

Weather and wind conditions can cause cyanobacterial blooms to move from one

location in the lake to another. Therefore, this advisory will remain in effect for Lac Ste. Anne until further notice.

Please note waters of Lac Ste. Anne in which the cyanobacterial bloom is NOT visible can still be used for recreational purposes, even while this Health Advisory is in place.

If you're spending time on or around the water, please help by keeping the following in mind:

- **Slow down on the water.** Large boat wakes can contribute to shoreline erosion and create additional challenges for residents working to protect their properties. Please minimize your wake whenever possible, particularly near residences and areas with high water levels.
- **Respect private property.** Do not enter flooded or damaged properties without permission.
- **Respect road closures and barricades.** Flooded or damaged roads can become unsafe without warning. Never drive around barricades or through standing water.
- **Avoid unnecessary travel in affected areas.** Some roads remain closed, restricted, or subject to rapidly changing conditions. If you do not need to travel into a flood-affected area, please consider postponing your visit.
- **Give crews room to work.** Municipal crews, emergency responders, contractors, and utility providers continue to work throughout the region. Please slow down, follow all directions, and allow them to work safely.
- **Stay informed before you travel.** Check current road closures, advisories, and local updates before heading out, as conditions can change quickly.
- **Be a respectful neighbour.** Many residents have experienced property damage, evacuations, and significant disruption. Patience, understanding, and consideration can make a meaningful difference during this difficult time.
